Jennifer DeVoe, M.D., M.Phil., D.Phil.

Dr. DeVoe received her M.D. from Harvard Medical School and her M.Phil. and D.Phil. in Economic and Social History from Oxford University, where she studied as a Rhodes Scholar from 1996-2001. She then completed a residency in family medicine and a post-doctoral research fellowship at Oregon Health and Science University in Portland, Oregon, where she is currently an Assistant Professor in the Department of Family Medicine.

Dr. DeVoe's research projects focus on evaluating the impact of policy changes in the Oregon Health Plan and studying children's access to health care services and health insurance programs. She is the recipient of a K08 Mentored Clinical Scientist Award from the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality, which has enabled her to continue working collaboratively with researchers at the state Office for Oregon Health Policy and Research. She is also a member of the Oregon Health Research and Evaluation Collaborative, a partnership between academic researchers and state policy-makers.

Her work recently informed Governor Kulongoski's "Healthy Kids" policy initiatives. In addition, she has had the privilege to collaborate with researchers in Washington D.C. at the Robert Graham Center for Policy Studies in Family Medicine and Primary Care, and the National Primary Care Research and Development Centre in Manchester, England. Dr. DeVoe has a part-time clinical practice in her S.W. Portland neighborhood, where she has cared for patients and taught students for the past seven years.
